

Mowrer will also argue that the RV laws make vehi-

cles unusable for the purpose for which they were designed. "It will end up taking the property of these poor people since they'll get tickets and not be able to pay them. The City knows their vehicles will be towed."

He concluded, "We're still fighting and pushing on.... Our arguments are correct.... The court is going to have [to have] the courage to risk offending the powers that be, the Santa Barbara City Council, and those who support this law."
